## REACH Regulation (EC) No 1907/2006

Regulation (EC) No 1907/2006 (REACH) is extending the responsibility, information rights and obligations of our produced bare printed circuit boards (PCB) and contained substances.

We are aware of our legal and environmental responsibility and review legal compliance regularly. This is ensured by our ISO-9001 management system.

### REACH Statement

A bare PCB is not intended to release a substance under normal or reasonably foreseeable conditions of use. The REACH Regulation defines an article as "an object which during production is given a special shape, surface or design which determines its function to a greater degree than its chemical composition". For this reason bare PCBs have to be considered as articles without intentional release of substances and do not have to be registered.

### Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC) – Compliance Declaration

The delivered products do not contain any Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC), respectively above a limit of 0.1 mass-percent, listed on the ECHA REACH Candidate List. The first list of SVHC was published on October 28<sup>th</sup> 2008. The latest version dates January 21<sup>st</sup> 2025, including 247 substances.

Where production is concerned, we are totally committed to compliance with all statutory requirements for occupational safety and health and environmental protection. Our PCBs are so produced thus that, according to the current state of knowledge, they cause no health risks to the user and no damage to the environment, if used in the intended manner.

All information has been given to the best of our knowledge and belief based on the information available to us from our suppliers. The information given implies no warranty within the meaning of the warranty law.
